Dear Church Family,

Hopefully by now you already know that this coming Sunday, July 19, we're going to be regathering here at the church building for corporate worship. We're really excited about getting back together to sing, study, pray, and worship the Lord, and we hope you will join us.

As we regather, please review our guidelines found on our website at underthesteeple.com and take note of some changes that will go into effect this coming Sunday. For starters, we will go back to our normal Sunday worship times (8:30, 9:45, 11am, and 6pm for evening service), and we will start back our Wednesday night prayer meeting in the sanctuary at 6pm on July 22 (no meal). We will also continue to enter in the building through the Fellowship Hall entrance only and exit out the east side of the building. We will have nursery available for children up to 2 years of age and drop off/pick up will be on the east entrance near the nursery. We will continue to discourage physical contact (hugs, handshakes, etc...), keep with 6ft in social distancing, and sit together only in family groups (ushers will seat and dismiss you in order to help keep with physical spacing). If you are in the "high risk" category according to the CDC and MSDH, we are advising you to stay home and continue to worship with us online or on TV.

One last guideline is a new one, but something we feel is important. Starting this Sunday and into the foreseeable future, we will be requiring the proper use of masks for all of our worship services. I'll be honest, this was a difficult decision to make. It's not an emotional decision or one that we made hastily. But through much prayer and discussion, and in talking with our medical advisors, our leadership feels that going mask mandatory significantly mitigates the risks of catching the virus, while also allowing us to worship together consistently week to week. At the end of the day we feel this is the wisest thing for us to do, based on the information given, to keep one another safe.

I know that it's possible that some may think we are acting out of fear, rather than faith. But I would encourage everyone to see this not as a faith vs. fear decision, but as a "love for my neighbor" decision. The Lord has called us to love him supremely, and to love others sacrificially (Matt. 22:37-39). And what an incredible opportunity for us to do that. So please come with your own personal masks, and if you forget, no worries, we will have one available for you. May God continue to keep us safe, and may our confidence always remain in Him!
